CHAPTER ONE

Purpose, Scope, Basis

Aim:

ARTICLE 1-The purpose of this directive is to provide the Vocational Schools throughout the university, To establish their own Advisory Boards and determine their working principles in order to establish and maintain relations with the labor market.

Scope:

ARTICLE 2 - This directive applies to the Vocational Schools within Uludaÿ University, It covers the provisions regarding the work of the Advisory Boards established to establish and maintain relations with the labor market.

Rest:

ARTICLE 3-This directive has been prepared in accordance with Article 14 of the Higher Education Law No. 2547 and Article 11/a of the decisions taken in the 24th session of the General Assembly of Higher Education dated 22.12.2008 (2008.24.2562).

CHAPTER TWO

Definitions, Organs, Functions

Definitions:

ARTICLE 4-In this directive:

- a. The Board, the Advisory Board,
- b. The unit refers to the relevant Vocational School that carries out the training program,
- c. MEYOK defines the Vocational Schools Coordination Office.

Board Members:

ARTICLE 5 - University Member Board Members

The following University members are included in the Boards:

- 1. Technical Programs Advisory Board: MEYOK Coordinator (Board Chair), Vocational School Directors, Vice Directors responsible for Education of Vocational Schools, Technical Programs Department Head of each Vocational School, if any, and a Technical Program Head appointed by the Directorate to represent the Technical Program Heads.
- 2. <u>Economic and Administrative Programs Advisory Board</u>: MEYOK Coordinator (Board Chairman), Vocational Schools Directors, Vocational Schools Education

Deputy Directors responsible, Head of Social Programs Department of each Vocational School, if any, and a program head appointed by the Directorate to represent the Social Program Heads.

3. <u>Health Programs Advisory Board: MEYOK Coordinat</u>or (Board Chair), Vocational School Directors, Vice Directors responsible for Education of Vocational Schools, Health Programs Department Head of each Vocational School, if any, and a program head assigned by the Directorate to represent the Health Program Heads.

The secretarial duties of the Board's work are carried out by the MEYOK Secretariat.

ARTICLE 6 - Determination of Other Board Members and Their Terms of Office

The Rector appoints at least seven members from outside the University, who have the qualifications specified in the additional list and are recommended by MEYOK, to each board established specifically for MEYOK/Department.

The term of office of the members is limited to two years. A member whose term of office has expired may re-appoint However, the same member cannot be appointed for more than three terms.

If the members appointed to represent their institutions terminate their duties at their institutions, their board memberships also terminate.

Duties and Responsibilities:

ARTICLE 7 - Board members examine the agenda program sent to them in advance and determine their views on establishing and maintaining relations with the labor market.

opens the meeting for discussion and submits its opinions and suggestions in writing to the Chairman of the Board.

The Board's decisions are advisory in nature. However, the Advisory Committees for MEYOK/Vocational Schools, MEYOK Program and Scientific Boards may evaluate the Advisory Board's views and suggestions in order to reflect them in the education program and submit them to the relevant boards.

The Board convenes with the presence of more than half of the members and decisions are taken on the basis of majority vote of the participants.

Working Principles of the Boards:

ARTICLE 8 - Conduct of Correspondence

Communication for board members who are on duty in the boards and who will participate from outside the Vocational Schools is carried out through correspondence made by MEYOK. The Directorate/Department Head is authorized for correspondence within the Vocational School. Keeping the minutes during the meeting and preparing the board work report are the responsibility of the Board President.

ARTICLE 9 - Work Schedule

Advisory Boards meet at least twice a year, in the spring and fall semesters, upon invitation from MEYOK to all members. Regular meetings are held before the relevant unit course program is submitted to the Senate. Extraordinary meetings may be held when necessary. Board meeting dates are announced in writing by the MEYOK Secretariat.

Meetings are held in the meeting halls of the University with the participation of the members specified in Articles 5 and 6.

ARTICLE 10 - Working Agenda and Documents

The temporary working agenda of the Board is determined by MEYOK. The main agenda is decided by the board.

The Provisional Agenda and a report on the previous meeting and the developments after the meeting, It is sent to the members by the Board Chairman at least two weeks before the meetings.

The minutes kept during the meeting shall be shared with the entire Board within two weeks after the meeting. are communicated to members in written or electronic form.

CHAPTER THREE

CHAPTER TWO

DEFINITIONS, ORGANS, DUTIES

Definitions:

Article 4. In this guideline:

a. Board defines the Employer Advisory

Board, b. Unit defines the relevant Faculty/Department that runs the training program.

Board Members:

Article 5. University Member Board Members

Each Board established specifically for a Faculty/Department includes the following University members:

- A. For the Faculty of Medicine, Dean (Board Chair), Vice Dean Responsible for Education, Department Heads, Department Head Representatives: Internal Medicine Department, General Surgery Department, Obstetrics and Gynecology Department, Child Health and Diseases Department Chairs, Faculty Accreditation Board Chair and relevant board members to be determined by him, Education Program Development Board Chair
- B. For the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, Dean (Board Chair), Vice Dean Responsible for Education, Department Heads, Heads of Departments with a maximum total credit load of 4 Departments in the education program: Department of Surgery, Department of Microbiology, Department of Internal Medicine, Department of Food Hygiene and Technology, Head of the Faculty Accreditation Board and relevant board members to be determined by him, Head of the Education Program Development Board
- C. For the Faculty of Theology, Dean (Board Chair), Vice Dean Responsible for Education, Department Heads, 3 faculty members recommended by the Faculty Board, Faculty Accreditation Board Chair and relevant board members determined by him, Education Program Development Board Chair
- D. For the Faculty of Agriculture, the Program Coordinator (Board Chair), Department Heads included in the Program, Program Coordination Board members, Faculty Accreditation Board Chair, Dean or Vice Dean responsible for education (as Monitor)
- E. For the Fine Arts and Foreign Languages Departments of the Faculty of Education, the Department Head (Board Chair), all faculty members of the Department and faculty members recommended by the US President, the Faculty Accreditation Board Chair, Department Head, Dean or Vice Dean responsible for education (as an observer)
- F. For other faculties (Science-Literature, Engineering-Architecture, Economics and Administrative Sciences, other departments of the Faculty of Education), Department Head (Board Chair), All faculty members of the department and faculty members recommended by the US Presidents, Faculty Accreditation Board Chair, Dean or Vice Dean responsible for education (as an observer)

The secretariat of the Board's work is carried out by the relevant Dean's Office.

Article 6. Determination of Other Board Members and Their Terms of Office

The Rector appoints a maximum of 7 members from outside the University who have the qualifications specified in the additional lists to each committee established specifically for the Faculty/Department.

The term of office of the members is limited to two years. A member whose term of office has expired may be re-elected. However, the same member cannot be appointed for more than three terms.

The members appointed to represent their institutions shall cease their duties in their institutions. In case of termination, their board membership also ends.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Article 7. Board members examine the education-training program sent to them in advance, determine their views on the improvement and development of education, open them for discussion, and convey their views and suggestions in writing to the Board President.

The Board's decisions are advisory in nature. However, the Faculty/Department Curriculum Development Board may evaluate the Advisory Board's views and suggestions in order to reflect them in the curriculum and submit them to the relevant boards.

Working Principles of the Boards:

Article 8. Conducting Correspondence

Communication for board members who are on duty and will be participating from outside the faculty is carried out through correspondence prepared by the Department/Program Head and made by the Dean's Office. The Dean's Office/Department Head is authorized for intra-faculty correspondence. It is the responsibility of the Board Chair to keep minutes of the meeting and prepare the board's work report.

Article 9. Work Schedule

Curriculum Advisory Boards meet at least twice a year, in the spring and fall semesters, upon invitation from the Faculty Dean/Department Head to all members.

Regular meetings are held before the relevant unit course program is submitted to the Senate for decision. Extraordinary meetings may be held when necessary. Board meeting dates are announced in writing by the relevant Dean's Office.

Meetings are held in the meeting halls of the University with the participation of the members specified in Articles 5 and 6.

Article 10. Working Agenda and Documents

The Board's interim Working Agenda is determined by the Dean of the Faculty/Head of Department/Head of Program The main agenda is determined by the board.

The Provisional Agenda and a report on the previous meeting and post-meeting developments It is sent to the members by the Board Chairman at least 2 weeks before the meetings.

The minutes kept during the meeting shall be shared with the entire Board within 2 weeks after the meeting. are communicated to members in written or electronic form.
