## Two Best Practice Examples from BUUSFL

### ★ Best Practice Spotlight

#### Differentiation in Listening & Speaking – by Öğr. Gör. Nihan Özuslu Güngör

In her B1 lesson on environmental problems, Nihan Hoca applied EDI by adjusting each task to learners' needs.

##### Warm-up:

She gave higher-level students an infographic to analyze, while other students worked on a simpler matching activity using the same vocabulary.

##### Pre-listening:

She differentiated the process by having students prepare through visual cues, short discussions, or hands-on activities, depending on what helped them understand best.

##### While-listening:

She asked stronger learners to predict answers in pairs (a higher-order skill).

Other students completed an individual watch-and-match task.

After checking answers, she played the audio again with subtitles to support slower or struggling learners.

##### Post-listening:

Students completed a Think-Pair-Share activity to discuss solutions. She assigned online self-assessment material to students with internet access, while providing a paper-based version for students who could not access the online tools.

💡 EDI in Action: She used different materials (infographic, matching task, subtitles) and multiple participation modes to ensure every student could follow the lesson and meet the objective.

#### EDI in Storytelling – by Dr. Öğr. Gör. Billur Yıldırım

In her B1 storytelling lesson, Billur Hoca used EDI by adapting each stage of teaching to meet different learner needs while keeping the same objective for everyone. She began the lesson with a short lead-in that allowed shy students to respond using emojis or the chat box instead of speaking aloud. When presenting the narrative structure, she used Freytag's Pyramid as a visual aid and paired it with a simple real-life story so that both visual and contextual learners could follow the explanation.

During the language presentation, she highlighted descriptive language with clear examples and supported slower readers with text-based slides, while stronger students listened for patterns in the story.

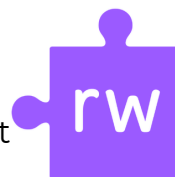
For the production stage, she gave students the choice to work individually or with a partner, helping them participate in the way they felt most comfortable.

### Why we love it:

Read&Write is an all-in-one accessibility tool that supports reading, writing, and vocabulary development —perfect for creating inclusive language classrooms where all students can succeed.



### How to use it in your language classroom:

- Enable text-to-speech so students can listen to texts while reading.
- Use vocabulary support and suggestions for multilingual learners or students with different proficiency levels.
- Activate translation tools so students can switch between languages when needed.
- Use writing support, including spell-check, word prediction & grammar suggestions, to help students express themselves more confidently.

**Quick tip:** Set up Read&Write for your next writing assignment.

Give students the option to listen to one draft, highlight vocabulary they're unsure of, and then rewrite using suggestions.

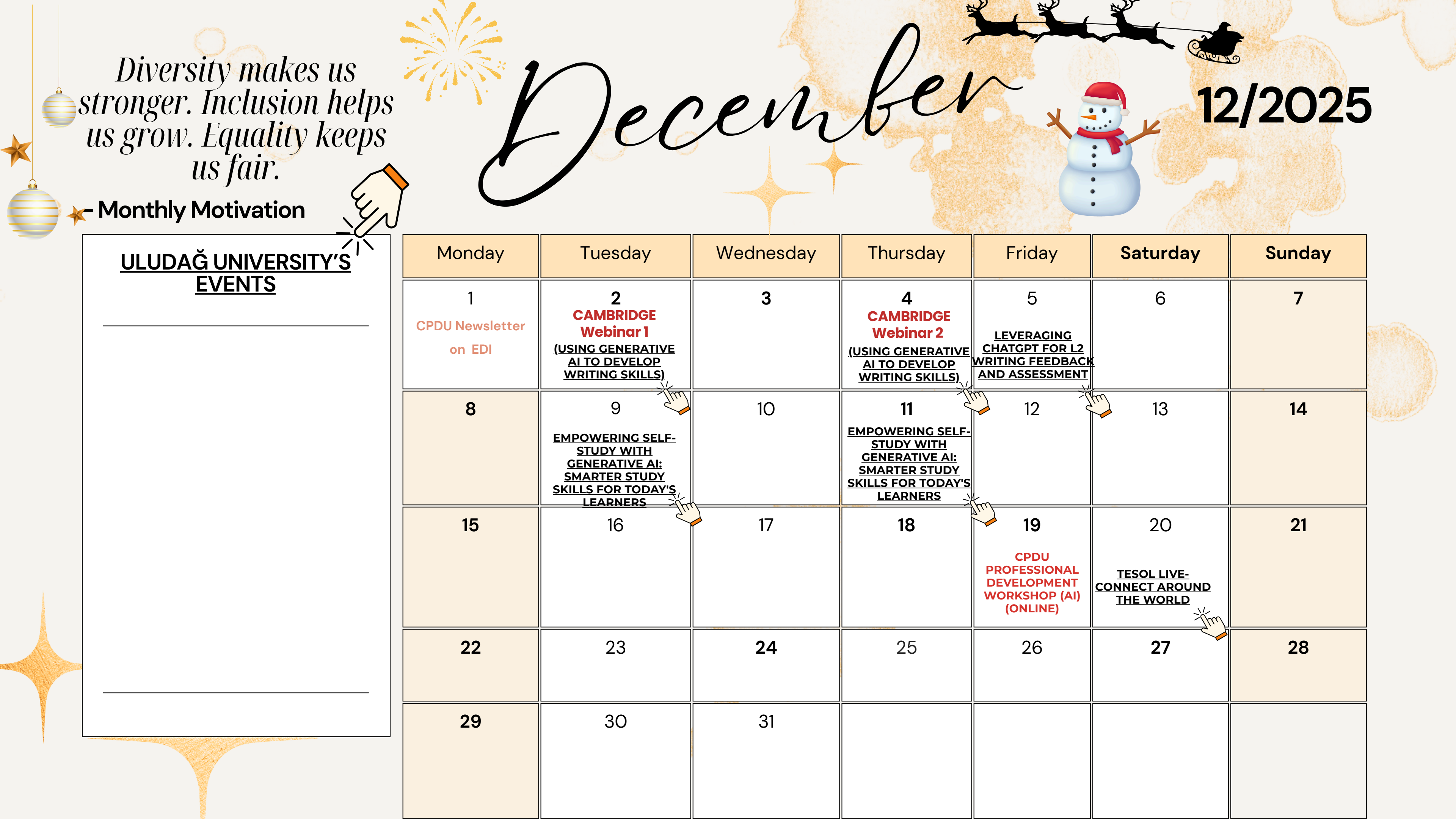
## Pour un environnement d'apprentissage inclusif à la diversité et à la culture francophones
